# Certificate of Competency in Management of Impacted Teeth



# Introduction

One of the most common problems that face a newly graduated dentist is managing patients with impacted wisdom teeth. Management of the patients require an appropriate risk assessment that leads to a decision of either to extract it or not. Moreover, management might require a referral of the patient to a specialist when the case is outside the scope of practice of a general dentist.

## Aim of the course

To enable general dentists to manage patients with problems related to impacted wisdom teeth.

## Competencies (By the end of this course, the participants should be able to:)

- 1. Diagnose patients with problems related to impacted wisdom teeth.
- 2. Formulate a treatment plan for patients with impacted wisdom teeth.
- 3. Assess the risk associated with surgical removal of impacted wisdom teeth.
- 4. Perform surgical extraction of soft tissue impacted wisdom teeth.
- 5. Mange complications associated with surgical removal of impacted wisdom teeth.

## **Course structure**

The course is structured over **10 days**. It involves **4 days** of theory and **6 days** of clinical practice as follow:

# Clinical Sessions (9.00 Am - 4.00 PM)

The clinical session will involve a supervised practice by all the participants on real patients. Each participant will manage 6 to 10 patients of with impacted wisdom teeth under the supervision of the two faculty.

## Management will involve:

- 1. Patient examination
- 2. Request and interpretation of CBCT
- 3. Surgical removal of the impacted tooth
- 4. Providing postoperative instructions
- 5. Prescribing the required medications

All patients will be consented before the beginning of the procedure.

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
